

LMC Undergraduate Research Request – LMC 2699/4699

Deadline for Submissions: First Day of Classes by 4 pm

LMC 2699/4699 Undergraduate Research is a course on a topic of the student's choosing with a faculty member with expertise/experience on the topic. Credit for this is taken on a letter-grade basis only. LMC 2699 is for students with less than 60 credit hours earned; LMC 4699 is for students with 60 hours or more.

The work required for a three-credit research course is equivalent to the work required in a normal three-credit classroom course. The supervising faculty member and the student determine the topic, requirements, and a schedule of meetings for the course. The faculty member submits a grade for the student at the end of the semester like a regular class.

The decision to pursue an undergraduate research course, in which the student will be studying and researching independently, should not be made hastily. The course requires steady, regular work and much more discipline on the part of the student since there is not a class that meets regularly or continual assessment by the professor as there is for standard courses. A request for an undergraduate research course must have a synopsis of the work to be completed and a description of the anticipated outcome submitted to amanda.blocker@lmc.gatech.edu along with this form. No form will be accepted or signed without both of these elements.

The form should be completed by the student and supervising faculty member and submitted to Amanda Blocker for processing. If approved, the course will be created and the student will receive instructions and a special CRN. The student will still need to register themselves for the course in Oscar with the designated CRN.
